**Microchipped cats and dogs, wearing a Council-issued tag, have the best chance of being quickly returned.**

**Are your furry friends microchip details up-to-date? If you don't know the answer, now is the time to act.**



To find out if your pet's microchip details are up-to-date:

- » go to [petaddress.com.au](http://petaddress.com.au)
- » enter their microchip number
- » contact the microchip registry your pet is listed with
- » check your contact details are correct



**If you are unsure of your pet's microchip number?**

Check your animal registration renewal form or contact your local veterinary clinic or shelter and arrange a time to have your pet scanned.

# Microchipping FAQs



## ***What is a microchip?***

A chip, the size of a rice grain, inserted between the shoulder blades of your feline or canine companion.

## ***What is the purpose of a microchip?***

To provide permanent identification of your pet.

## ***When does microchipping occur?***

Microchipping of cats and dogs must be done by 3 months of age.

## ***Must an animal be microchipped before registration with Council?***

Yes, microchipping is a condition of registration with Council (which is compulsory once your cat or dog is 3 months old).

## ***When must your pet wear a Council-issued tag?***

All cats and dogs must wear a Council tag when outside their premises.
