


Do you manage a building that has Council bins?




By using food and green waste bins, residents of your building could reduce the amount of waste that goes in their garbage bins by 40%.



If you are able to replace any garbage bins with food and green waste bins, your building could save hundreds of dollars every year.



Why?



When food waste goes to landfill it creates methane, a powerful greenhouse gas that contributes to climate change. Right now, more than a quarter of the waste we send to landfill in Stonnington is food waste.

Stonnington buildings that have Council bins can throw their food scraps into their food and green waste bins - meaning less waste will go to landfill and instead will be turned into rich compost for Victorian farms.

Save your building money



Food and green waste bins are the most cost-effective bin your building can use, as organic waste is easy to turn into nutritious, valuable compost.

Did you know that over 40% of the average Stonnington garbage bin is made up of food and green waste?

Council allows Owners Corporations to apply and pay for shared food and green waste bins for the buildings they manage. Instead of adding the cost of the bins to rates notices, we invoice directly to Owners Corporations annually.

If your building has multiple 240L garbage bins, getting food and green waste bins could allow you to send back a garbage bin or two.



What are the other options?



If your building doesn't have Stonnington bins, there are some other ways that you can support residents in reducing the amount of food waste they send to landfill.


If your building has a shared outdoor space, you are eligible for Council's Apartment Composting Program. This program allows buildings to access up to three communal worm farms or home composters, free of charge.



Stonnington will also provide free workshops for residents on how to use their composting systems and free kitchen caddies to support residents to separate and transport food waste.
